WENDY EWALD THE CHIAPAS PORTFOLIO

Forthcoming publication, February 2023 Mullowney Printing, Portland, Oregon

Mullowney Printing is pleased to announce the forthcoming publication by photographer Wendy Ewald, *The Chiapas Portfolio*, a collection of photogravure images from her 1991 project Retratos y Suenos which came from her work with children living in Chiapas, Mexico.

In 1991, Wendy Ewald was invited to conduct photography classes for Maya, Ladino, and Tzotzil speaking children living in Chiapas, the southernmost province of Mexico, by the writer's cooperative Sna Jtz'ibajom (the House of the Writer). While cameras and camcorders were hardly novelties in Chiapas at the time, they were generally used by tourists whose picture taking tended to reinforce their own cultural biases. Ewald did not take pictures. Instead, she guided her students to take their own photographs, which depicted their daily lives, dreams, desires, and fantasies. The photographs resonated with the significance of dreams in Maya culture, which considers them as real as waking life. The resulting project offers a unique insight into the everyday realities of the life in Maya communities just before the Zapatista uprising.

With *The Chiapas Portfolio* Ewald strives to create a contemporary conversation between her 1991 project and that of the American photographer Paul Strand and his seminal work, *Photographs of Mexico* portfolio of photogravures made from photographs he took in Mexico in the 1930s. The collection of gravures was originally published as Photographs of Mexico in 1940, and later re-published as *The Mexican Portfolio*, in 1967.

About Wendy Ewald

Working as a photographer and teacher, Ewald's projects emphasize a method of collaboration that challenges the distinctions between photographer and subject. Adopting a variety of approaches, she creates projects based on a reciprocal vs. hierarchical approach. Her goal is to provide the vision of her subjects rather than merely make images of them. Through her documentary investigations of places and communities, Ewald probes questions of identity and cultural differences. In her work with children and women, she encourages them to use cameras to record themselves, their families, and their communities, and to articulate their fantasies and dreams.
